Hungry

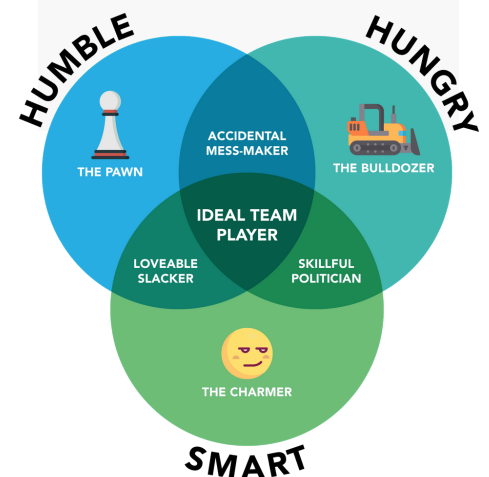
Self-motivated and diligent.

Seek to Unify - Unity is more important than our personal desires. We all have our own preferences, ideas, and thoughts. Christ did too. But He came in meekness, willingly giving up His rights (Philippians 2:6-7). This kind of spirit is rare indeed. In today's world, we are probably more likely to hear, "I'm not going to be anyone's doormat!" than, "Let's try it your way."

Putting star players on the same team does not necessarily equal championships. Too often, they are more interested in padding their stat lines instead of doing what is best for the team. They damage unity and the team falls short of its championship hopes. Sometimes, players show their greatest strength by doing what is best for the team instead of what may be best for them individually.
